Prof Hanif Kara

Hanif contributes 40+ years' experience in the delivery and strategic leadership of design. He grew up in Uganda, arriving in the UK as a refugee in the 1970s, and in 2022 was awarded the Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) for his services to architecture, engineering and education: a rare recognition of three distinct disciplines.

Hanif is a co-founder and design director of the international design-engineering practice AKT II. The company has been operating for 25+ years, and today unites 300+ people who are together working across 50+ countries; Hanif has driven the firm's pioneering 'design-led' ethos. The practice's service to both the art and science of design has so far been recognised with 400+ design awards, which includes four RIBA Stirling Prize wins (in 2000, 2012, 2018 and 2021) - the UK's highest architectural honour.

In parallel, Hanif has taught widely. He's currently a professor-in-practice for architectural technology with the Harvard University's Graduate School of Design (the Harvard GSD), and a visiting professor for the UK's vocation-focussed Engineering & Design Institute (TEDI), having previously taught with London's Architectural Association School of Architecture (the AA) as well as for several further avant-garde design schools throughout mainland Europe. He's also currently a patron of the international architecture school The African Futures Institute (AFI).

Hanif furthermore serves regularly as an advisor and sounding-board member for numerous architectural, governmental and industry organisations worldwide. He was notably the first structural engineer to be appointed to the UK Design Council's Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment (CABE - which he's continued to serve in various advisory and design-review roles), as well as the first to be appointed to the RIBA's Stirling Prize Jury, President's Medal Jury and Honours Committee, and also the first to be appointed to the global Aga Khan Award for Architecture (AKAA) Master Jury and Steering Committee.

At a national level within the UK, he's currently on the National Infrastructure Commission (NIC) Design Task Force as well as the HS2 design-review panel, and he's previously been on the design roundtable for Network Rail. In London specifically, he's been an appointed Design Advocate for the Mayor of London's office while his wider industry appointments have ranged from thinktanks such as New London Architecture (the NLA), and local authorities such as

the London Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, to development bodies such as the Old Oak and Park Royal Development Corporation (OPDC).

Finally, Hanif also serves routinely as a public communicator and speaker for international media endeavours. He's recently been a judge for the global Dezeen Awards, having also previously contributed expertise to the UK's Building Awards (organised by Building Magazine), the British Construction Industry Awards, and the awards programmes of both the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) and the Architects' Journal (the AJ), as well as for the global trade show MIPIM. He's also served for many years on Building Magazine's editorial board.

Hanif's insight into design, and particularly on the theme of 'interdisciplinarity', is meanwhile widely published throughout numerous books, magazines, media outlets and trade journals.
