Chat


Teams allows you to have threaded, asynchronous chats with anyone listed in the Harvard Directory or from your personal contact list.

File Storage

Drag-n-drop file storage is available in Teams with no limitations on file type or size and the quota per Team is a very generous 25 Terabytes.



Microsoft Teams file storage was developed with the same platform used by Microsoft OneDrive which we use for personal file storage. In fact, you can access your OneDrive account from within Teams.

Video Calling

Teams video calling allows you to launch ad-hoc meetings with one click, either from within a chat or via the Meet Now button. See a demo on how to make a video call.
